It's a String Thing! Block of the Month for September 2012

September block - - - Black Accent Leading strip plus scrappy brights.

String piecing is addicting and fun. See the basic tutorial on the web, or ask Denise for a printed copy.



Cut foundation paper at 6" square

Cut accent strip 2" wide (approx.6 1/2" long)

Accent strip color is:

Black solid or a black tone on tone print

All other strings: scrappy brights!

After pressing, trim your square to 5 1/2" square.

Make 4 for 1 set to exchange at the meeting.

Basics and Hints:

- Use a larger needle (14 or 16)
- Shorten your stitch length
- Press your seams as you go to keep your blocks from curling and getting wonky
- 4 blocks make a set.... for every 4 blocks your name goes in one time.
- Try to use enough variety of strings that you don't repeat within each foundation.
- Vary the width of your strings for more movement and texture in your blocks
- Blocks within each set **do not** have to be identical or matched sets.... The scrappier the better!
- A little starch or "best press" will help control any stretching after the paper is removed.

Possible setting ideas for this block:

- Use them as a "piano key" border
- Stich into 4 patches rotating each sub block

Have fun! I stitched all four of my blocks in about 1 ½ hours, and that included cutting the foundation papers and removing the papers and trimming my blocks.
