

June "16 patch" center: finishes at 6"

Fabric



Color

Blue or Red

(opposite of your flying geese units)

Cut

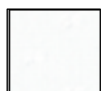
Cut 1 - 2" x 20" strip



White tone on tone background

Cut 1 - 2" x 20" strip

You will also need:



White tone on tone background

4 - 3 1/2" squares



Flying geese Units

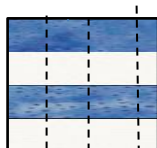
4 - Measuring 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" unfinished
(Use the method of your choice)

Sewing: Use a scant 1/4" seam



Stitch the two strips together. Press towards the darker fabric.

Cut the strip set in half, and stitch together again, alternating colors. Press the second seam towards the dark.



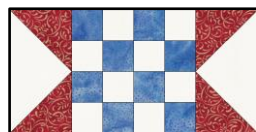
Cut the strip set into 4 segments, each measuring 2".



Turn 2 strip set segments so that you can create a checkerboard.

Stitch together. Press.

Measure to make sure it is 6 1/2"



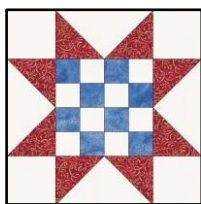
Add flying geese units to two opposite sides of the sixteen patch.

Press towards the center



Add background squares to the ends of both remaining flying geese units.

Press towards the corner squares.



Finally, stitch the remaining flying geese and corner units to the last two sides of your block. Press.

Measure to make sure your block is 12 1/2"
