

March "Churn dash" center: finishes at 6"

Cut
Cut 1 - 2 1/2" square
Cut 2 - 3" squares
Cut 1 - 1 1/2" x 11" strip

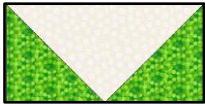
Cut 2 - 3" squares
Cut 1 - 1 1/2" x 11" strip

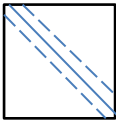
4 - 3 1/2" squares



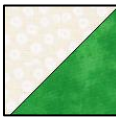
Green #1 & White
Flying geese
Units

4 - Measuring 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" unfinished
(Use the method of your choice)

Sewing: Use a scant 1/4" seam



Place a green and white 3" square right sides together. Draw a line from one corner to the opposite diagonal corner. Stitch on either side of this line 1/4".



Cut apart. Press towards the green triangles. Repeat with the remaining 2 squares, to create a total of 4 half square triangle blocks. Trim to 2 1/2".



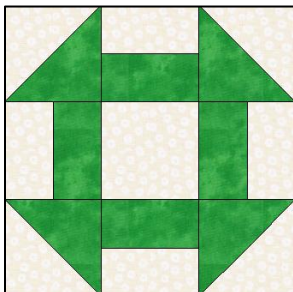
Stitch the green and white strip together. Press towards the green. Cut into 4 segments that measure 2 1/2" long.



Stitch the pieces together to make 2 rows that look like the picture on the left. Press towards the strip.

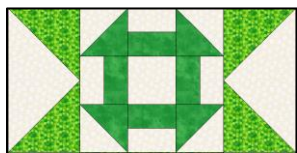


Stitch the remaining pieces together to assemble the center row. Press towards the strips on the outside.



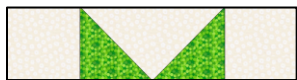
Stitch the rows together to create your churn dash. Press.
Measure to make sure it is 6 1/2"

March "Churn dash" center: (continued)



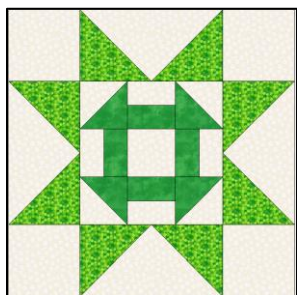
Add flying geese units to two opposite sides of the churn dash block.

Press towards the center



Add background squares to the ends of both remaining flying geese units.

Press towards the corner squares.



Finally, stitch the remaining flying geese and corner units to the last two sides of your block. Press.

Measure to make sure your block is 12 1/2"
